Fix My Street Super User Volunteers

Oxfordshire County Council created OXTOG – Oxfordshire Together – to mobilise and support a team of volunteers around the County to help look after their own roads, pavements and public rights of way. As part of OXTOG there is a growing team of volunteers known as Fix My Street Super Users.

The Super Users are, in effect, the 'eyes and ears' of the County Council Highways Officers and are trained to report and action certain road repairs, specifically potholes and damaged kerbs, on low-speed, minor roads using Fix My Street.

The Volunteer Co-ordination team at Oxfordshire County Council is currently recruiting more Fix My Street Super Users in this area. The training takes place online in small groups.

Call for communities to plant trees in record numbers:

Communities and groups across South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse are being urged to put plans in place now, so they are ready to plant trees in record numbers during the annual tree planting season, later this year.

Carbon dioxide (CO₂) produced through the burning of fossil fuels, waste, and other materials is the most prominent greenhouse gas contributing to climate change. Trees capture and store this gas when it enters the atmosphere and so are vital in helping us to tackle the climate emergency.

South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils are therefore calling on people to play their part and plant trees in their local neighbourhood.

The best time to carry out planting is from November to March, when the weather and land conditions are usually at their most suitable for trees to adapt to their new surroundings and grow. However, it can take a while to organise tree planting projects, so people should plan now to ensure they are ready for when the season begins and can maintain and establish the trees for several years.

If you are involved in a tree planting project, or wish to get involved in being part of a record planting season, please visit southoxon.gov.uk/treeplanting for advice. Cllr Peter Dragonetti, Tree Champion at South Oxfordshire District Council, said: said: "As well as the many environmental advantages, trees also provide great health and well-

being benefits for everyone, and wonderful scenery across the district, so a record setting tree planting season would really benefit us all!"

Waste Team South and Vale Litter Survey

The two District councils recently launched a joint litter mapping project aimed at identifying where and what type of items are littered, this information will then be used to target those areas.

Throughout the summer-long survey litter pickers are asked to record the location and types of litter either online using our survey or by post using a set number of criteria available on our website.

Litter is defined as any item left out in public which should have been put in a bin. While the results from litter pickers might include some surprise items (a recent litter pick in Drayton St Leonard unearthed a Victorian Bovril bottle) the survey includes categories for the most commonly-littered items including:

- · Bagged dog poo
- Bottles
- Cans
- · Cigarette butts
- Food items
- Fast food packaging
- · Face masks and disposable gloves

When results are collated later this year, then littering in the districts can be more accurately mapped and the information passed on to the councils' envirocrime team to ensure those areas are regularly patrolled. In addition, the councils' waste team can use the mapping to increase awareness among communities of any litter issues in their areas. The project results can also feed into the ongoing review of litter bins in the districts.

We would be very grateful if you could share this information with any litter pickers you know of in your areas. The litter picks do not need to have taken place on district council land: the more data we gather, the better!
