Where does any profit go? We use some of it to hold a reserve, mainly to cushion against the dreaded rainy day, but the bulk goes towards donations to good causes - Local Scouts, Parish Hall, Church maintenance, Hospices, upkeep of local landmarks, National Charities, and similar.


Broadband

Parts of this parish, such as Crays Pond can now get Faster Broadband because they are close to the telephone exchange in Woodcote. For Whitchurch Hill, served by Pangbourne exchange, the promise is that we will get Faster Broadband by December this year. Whitchurch Hill is currently served by a BT Cabinet located on the footpath at the top of the hill, but this has been found to be incapable of being upgraded to meet the need, so it is being replaced or supplemented by two new cabinets, one for the east side of the village and one for the west. This should cover most of Whitchurch Hill, but in the current plan, some parts of the village including post codes RG8 7PW, 7NY, 7NZ and 7NU are not projected to be included in the faster broad band scheme. There are further developments to the programme so there might be changes. Check the latest position on



Mobile Library Service

Following the consultation on proposed changes, new routes and timetables will be introduced with effect from Monday July 6th 2015.

The Service listened to all comments and suggestions and amended the proposed list of stops in response to this feedback. As a result: some stops that it had been proposed to replace have been reinstated; the locations of some stopping places within a community have been changed to reflect local knowledge; and some stopping times have been reviewed. No stop that was proposed to be retained and that is currently visited by customers has been withdrawn and the mobile library service model now includes 229 stops rather than the 200 stops that were proposed at consultation.

Any changes made to the consultation proposal are as a result of feedback received at local level and address the detail of the local stop. The over-arching proposal to retain seven mobile library vehicles, maximising our existing resources in order to bring significant benefit for more people has not been changed. The new service will comprise: 4 general service mobile library vehicles serving communities; 1 dedicated home library service vehicle delivering to individuals who are unable to otherwise access library services; and 2 mobile libraries visiting primary schools to promote reading for pleasure.

Details of stops and timetables are available online on the county council website and in hard copy on mobile library vehicles.

Henley Citizens Advice Bureau alerts pensioners to potential scams

Henley CAB has issued a warning to pensioners about scammers targeting their pension savings in the wake of the new pension rules. Five types of scams have been reported:

- 1. Pension "transfers": Scammers charge pensioners high fees for moving their pensions but nothing happens; or the money is moved without their permission; or, if the pensioner agrees to the transfer, the money vanishes or is transferred to fraudulent schemes.
- 2. Pension savings become "investments": People are told that they can get more out of their savings by investing in goods like wine, or "revolutionary" new products or projects.
- 3. Pension "advice": Scammers offer "free" pension advice or a review of the victim's savings, which can cost money and be useless, or might just be a cover for obtaining crucial personal details.
- 4. Pensioners are offered services for a fee. In some cases no service is provided at all. In others, a service is provided but it is either expensive or not in the consumer's best interest
- 5. Contacting people by email or telephone, scammers persuade victims to hand over personal data like their National Insurance number and bank account details. Sometimes the scammers will use information they already have, such as name of the victim's employer or pension provider.

Pension scam advice

- 1. Inform someone else about a possible scam, an unsolicited phone call or text, or offer of money.
- 2. Never give out your bank details or send money unless you are certain you can trust the person who has asked you to do this.
- 3. Don't feel pressured to make a decision straight away. Take your time.

Whitchurch War Memorial Improvements

You may have heard that we are considering some improvements to the War Memorial we share with Whitchurch Hill. The Whitchurch on Thames and Goring Heath Parish Councils jointly manage the memorial. The Goring Heath Council has suggested some improvements to the existing War memorial during the period of 2014 - 2018 in honour of the 100th anniversary of WW I.

Some of the improvements under consideration are:

- Re-establishment of the memorial 'steeple' to its full height pre-1989 storm damage, where the height of the obelisk was significantly reduced.
- Improved accessibility to the memorial from road where the path and road have deteriorated making access to the monument difficult, particularly for elderly people.
- An Interpretive Board giving details of those remembered on the Memorial and details of others of the Parishes who died in WW1 and yet may be on NO memorial.
- Improved sitting area with landscaping including a hedge.
- Professional cleaning of the memorial.

Given the importance of the memorial to both communities, we would like to get feedback from as many residents as possible before any changes are made. Following a well attended presentation on the 30th of May at the Old Stable in Whitchurch, both parish councils are keen for residents to give their options via the feedback form, email the clerk(s) and/or discuss your views with Councillor Martin Wise of Whitchurch Hill and Councillor Jim Donahue of Whitchurch on Thames

As the estimated costs for these improvements range from about £1500 to £19,000, we are planning to apply for a grant to cover most or all of this. The War Memorial Trust has already indicated that many of these improvements would be eligible for a grant.

The process for the improvements will be:

- Based on feedback from both Whitchurch on Thames and Whitchurch Hill communities, a grant for one or more options will be applied for during 2015
- Depending on the results of the grant, a recommendation will be made to both the Goring Heath and Whitchurch Parish Councils. The more expensive options that include restoring the old Steeple will only be pursued if a grant is awarded.
- If additional funding is required, this will be either requested to be split between the councils or a fundraising campaign initiated.
- It is anticipated that the actual restoration would happen during 2016/2017 to be completed for the WWI anniversary.
