We would also like to point out that No Strong Views is one of only three choices that SODC gives the parish council. It should not be read as illustrating tacit approval of an application. More often than not this choice is supplemented with specific comments from the parish council highlighting areas of concern.

Going up with a bang

People have expressed concern to the parish council over noisy fireworks, and the same issue has been highlighted in the Henley Standard.

There are low noise fireworks available, and perhaps in due course legislation will come in to control the noisy fireworks. Presumably legislation banned the sale of jumping jack and penny bangers, once a popular choice of children.

In the meantime, if you are planning fireworks, why not include some low noise ones, or make them all low noise.

Dreaming of a green Christmas

Oxfordshire County Council are encouraging people to to put anything that can't be eaten into their food caddy for recycling. Bones, dairy products, vegetable peelings and all other cooked and uncooked food can be recycled; Used Christmas trees need to be taken to any recycling centre to be composted.

If your recycling bin is struggling to cope with all the extra bottles, cardboard, plastic and paper, put any that can't fit into the bin in a clear plastic sack or cardboard box. Place it next to your bin on collection day.

The Oakley Wood recycling centre near Wallingford closes at 3pm on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve and will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day. Otherwise they will be open as normal from 8am-5pm.

Both meetings are at 8pm, coffee served from 7.30pm, and cost £3 to non-members, to include coffee and biscuits. For a better bargain why not join us?






