Chairman's Comments

According to the BBC website, the Prime Minister promised to scrap the Severn Bridge Toll if the Conservatives won the general election, and it seems that that is likely to happen at some point in the reasonably foreseeable future. At the moment, the cost for a car is £6.70, and the bridge is 1.6km long.. Recently, after visiting the 2017 City of Culture I used the Humber crossing which at 2.2km is even longer than the Severn crossing, but remarkably good value at £1.50. Working this out on a pence per metre basis, the Humber bridge is just 0.07 pence per metre, while the Severn Bridge is 0.2 pence per metre. Bridges in Scotland are even better value, for the tolls on the new Skye Bridge were scrapped a few years ago, and the Forth Road bridge is also now free.

Closer to home, the Eynsham Toll Bridge over the Thames near Witney costs the princely sum of 5 pence a crossing for the 44 metres of the bridge, so a net 0.11 pence per metre, and even closer to home the Whitchurch Toll bridge is, as we all know, 60 pence a crossing, which for the 80 metres makes it at 0.75pence a metre the most costly of the lot. It is widely believed that Whitchurch Toll Bridge is the most expensive in the UK, and so this would appear to be true. According to the accounts of the Bridge Company filed at Companies House, the bridge made a profit of over half a million pounds in the year to June 2016, so perhaps it is also the most profitable in the UK.

We would also like to point out that No Strong Views is one of only three choices that SODC gives the parish council. It should not be read as illustrating tacit approval of an application. More often than not this choice is supplemented with specific comments from the parish council highlighting areas of concern. If there is a feature of the application that we feel is not right, but overall we are content with the proposal, we will object. Often this leads to the feature being changed. This was the case with P17/ S1484 above.

Goring Heath Parish Council AGM Chairman's Report

Like last year our main objective this year has been to manage and maintain the hall so that it continues to be an attractive venue for the use of the inhabitants of Goring Heath. The maintenance can really fall into two categories firstly the necessary; keeping the fabric of the hall functional, watertight, heated etc. and the more fun which is improving the facility.

This year through necessity has predominately been about the former but with a few exceptions.

This time last year we were very concerned about the state of the south window which was rotten beyond repair. Fortunately with grants from SODC and the Big Lottery, a donation from the fete committee and £200 from our reserves we have been able to completely replace the south window and refurbish the east and west with double glazed units. In addition all three have been painted and with regular painting should last the hall for many years to come.

The situation with the main windows also led use to consider the exterior paint work generally on some of the smaller more standard windows. This led to a very successful working party in April which addressed the most urgent areas for which I am very grateful to Peter and John for their time and work. A follow up weekend is scheduled to make all the exterior woodwork protected before next winter and keep the hall looking smart.

As a group we believe that the hall needs to be kept in a smart and clean condition and well equipped in order to attract hirers to choose our hall over other local venues. In the coming year we intend to redecorate internally as the wainscoting and walls are looking a little tired if funds permit.

In terms of equipment we have purchased a new canteen of matching cutlery, new teapots and also some outdoor folding chairs. The latter are also an additional revenue stream as they are available for hire separately from the hall.

An improvement that we as a committee would like to make to the hall is to widen the main door from the lobby into the main hall as this quite often becomes a bottleneck for larger functions. This is in the very early stages of discussion and would require grant funding.

This year we hosted another of Mike Holland's ever popular quizzes which was well attended and a great success. These events, as well as being an excellent social opportunity for the local residents to meet and use the hall are also a good fund raiser for the upkeep of the facility. I would really like to thank Mike for his part as quizmaster and the trustees for all the effort they put into promoting the event, selling tickets and running the evening.

In February we also ran a very successful and enjoyable performance by Two Blokes and a Lady of Life's a Merry Go Round. Here again the committee as a whole and Theresa particularly put huge amounts of effort to promote the event encouraging people to buy tickets and then running the evening. I would really like to thank you all for this. To finish I would particularly like to thank Theresa the hall manager for her attention to detail, her good humour and amazing ability to deal with and keep the hirers happy, we are truly lucky to have her in this role. I would also like to thank Bill to solve hall maintenance issues, often at a moment's notice. Finally I would like to thank all the trustees for their continued support as without them the hall would not be the success that we all enjoy.

Help needed checking Hartslock sheep

Would you be keen to have a weekly walk on a beautiful nature reserve to help us check our sheep?

Hartslock Nature Reserve is a beautiful South facing slope of chalk grassland, located approximately a mile west of Whitchurch Hill towards Goring. Rich in wildflowers and butterflies, Hartslock is managed by The Berks, Bucks, and Oxon Wildlife Trust and known for its rare orchids and stunning views over the River Thames. The reserve is currently in a fabulous purple phase, covered in a blanket of marjoram, thyme, knapweed, scabious, bell flowers, and harebells. Definitely worth a visit. www.bbowt.org.uk/reserves/Hartslock

Mainly carried out by teams of volunteers and our lovely flock of sheep, we do a lot of work at Hartslock to keep the habitats in tip top condition. Tasks including clearing areas of encroaching scrub and brambles, maintaining pathways, gates and fences, and managing the vegetation. The sheep are a very important part of our team, grazing the grassland and encroaching scrub. Chalk grassland characteristically has shallow soils, lime rich, nutrient poor, with short vegetation. The flora and fauna at Hartslock thrive due to this and the carefully timed grazing and management.

We currently have a very friendly flock of Shetland sheep at Hartslock, but we also use Hebridean and Beulah sheep. These are hardy traditional breeds, all used to being out in all conditions, and grazing steep slopes.

The livestock are checked on a daily basis by a rota of kind volunteers, and at least once a week by BBOWT staff. Our stockwatchers are invaluable, without them we would be unable to carry out the essential grazing management on our nature reserves. A stockwatcher's main aim is to make sure the animals are all there, looking well, and are secure within the reserve with sufficient water. Stockwatchers generally commit to one day a week as part of a rota. Checks need to be carried out in daylight with at least 2 hours daylight remaining in order for us to respond to a livestock emergency.

We are currently looking for extra help at weekends, so if this appeals to you, please get in touch so we can discuss more details. No previous experience needed, and we will go through a full induction on site.

The Village Fete

Once again our thanks to all who helped make this year's Fete a great day out for all, and in particular to all those who volunteered to help run the various events and stalls. The Fete is hugely dependent on such assistance, and we are always glad to receive offers of assistance. So if you would like to get involved, please contact us at whitchurchhillfete@gmail.com

We are regularly asked three questions – and they all involve money! So here they are, along with some answers:

Does it cost much to run the Fete? Yes, it costs over £1000, and most of that is committed up front – paying for some of the performers, hiring marquees, arranging First Aid cover, buying BBQ ingredients, etc. So if it's raining, and numbers are down, we would likely lose almost all of that money. And if it's a nice day, with a good attendance, we should make a modest profit, typically in the region of £1250. So every Raffle Ticket you buy, every entry on the Tombola, every Burger you enjoy, each contribution you make, they all go to help us cover our costs, and ideally show some profit.

Do you run the Fete to make money? We have three objectives, and they are listed here in order of importance. The first is to provide the village with a day out for all to come together and enjoy. The second is to cover our costs, and as noted above, these are not inconsiderable. And the third is to try to make some profit, if we can.


Where does any profit go? We use a small amount to hold a reserve, mainly to cushion against the dreaded rainy day disaster referred to above. From time to time we have to invest modestly in renewing our equipment – for example, the Coconut Shy that we now use was built from scratch by one of our team. But the bulk goes towards donations to good causes. We focus these on the local area, with an occasional donation to a national charity that has had some role in the village, such as Macmillan Cancer Relief.

While we have been making such donations for many years, a quick glance at our records for the past five years shows we have donated over £6000 in that period to a range of deserving causes and projects. These include the Goring Heath Scouts, the upkeep of our Parish Hall, maintenance of St. John's Church, Hospices, a traffic safety system at a local school, the purchase of the Parish Defibrillator, local Volunteers, a Hospice, and the upkeep of local landmarks such as the Well Structure at Goring Heath and the restoration of the War Memorial.

From this year's funds we have so far contributed a further £1050. These donations went to the War Memorial Restoration Fund, St John's, and the Parish Hall. We will be making further donations in the coming months, and we hope for many years to come, thanks to your support for this popular village event.



Senior Strength Training Circuit
